Serving the northern part of the National Park, regular services, including late evening and Sundays, cover Middlesbrough to Scarborough via Guisborough, Whitby and many villages including Robin Hood's Bay. The Middlesbrough to Scarborough service (X93/X94) also offers free Wi-Fi.

X4 serves villages north of Whitby including Sandsend, Runswick Bay, Staithes and Saltburn-by-the-Sea through to Middlesbrough.

128 services runs daily between Scarborough and Helmsley. Calling at Nawton/Beadlam, Wombledon, Kirkbymoorside, Keldholme, Sinnington, Wretton, Aislaby, Middleton, Pickering, Thornton le Dale, Wilton, Allerston, Ebberston, Snainton, East Ayton, Seamer and Scarborough.

NB: Sunday services during the winter terminate at Pickering.

COUNTRYSIDE STOP-OFFS

Cleveland Way National Trail – One-way 109 mile walk from Helmsley to Filey, with circular walk options. Accessible via Coaster 12/13 and 128 (for start and finish)

Goathland (Harry Potter's Hogsmeade Station and Heartbeat's 'Aidsensfield')
Enjoy the walk to Mallyan Spout waterfall or across moorland to Wheeldale Roman Road. Accessed by Coastliner 840 service, and also on the NYMR line.

Hole of Horcum

A natural beauty spot in the National Park, ideal for walking/picnic. Accessed from Coastliner 840 Pickering < > Whitby service at Saltergate car park.

Hunmanby

A traditional picturesque village set on the edge of the Yorkshire Wolds looking towards the Yorkshire coast over farmland. As you walk through the village you will be reminded of a bygone era with a typical English village setting with its market place, village green, church, traditional chalk built houses, independent shops and pubs.

Kirkdale and St. Gregory's Minster – West of Kirkbymoorside. 1.5 mile walk from Kirkbymoorside or from Nawton/Beadlam on East Yorkshire 128.

Ravenscar village

First planned as a holiday resort in the late-19th century but never finished, Ravenscar has a dramatic view across to Robin Hood's Bay and a small National Trust visitor centre. Service 115 Scarborough < > Ravenscar.

Robin Hood's Bay

Once the haunt of smugglers, this National Park village is famous for its Jurassic-era fossils, sweeping bay and atmospheric alleys. Service Arriva X93/X94 Middlesbrough < > Scarborough.

Runswick Bay

Sheltered village in a lovely coastal setting with a wide bay and fine sands popular for paddling and stand up paddleboarding. Service Arriva X4 Middlesbrough < > Whitby.

Sandsend

A tranquil escape from the hustle and bustle of everyday life offering a quieter setting. A great spot for rock pooling, so grab your net and bucket and see what you can find.

Sinnington village

A pretty village set around a green, Sinnington is a good starting point for circular walks and picnic, or visit the Country Inn. Service 128 – Pickering < > Helmsley.

Staithes

A beautiful fishing village with a cosy harbour, a great location for geologists and fossil hunters and home to a community of well-known artists.

Thornton le Dale

An attractive village, well-known for its riverside thatched cottage, motor museum, village walks and gentle walk to Ellerburn (country church). Refreshments and craft shops. On Service 128 Pickering < > Scarborough, Coastliner 840 and Moorsbus network.

Welburn

Starting point for some walks with a great cafe and pub. Coastliner and East Yorkshire 81 Services.

ACCESSIBILITY

Many buses have low-level access and ramps for easy boarding. The North York Moors National Park Authority has developed a number of fully accessible routes for heavy duty wheelchairs and pushchairs through woodland, along riversides, by lakes, overlooking the Heritage Coast, through the heart of the moorland and around important archaeological sites. You can also hire a Trampler, an electric all-terrain mobility scooter, from Dalby Forest (T: 01751 460295), Danby Lodge and Sutton Bank National Park Centres, Ravenscar Visitor Centre and Forest Holidays at Keldy and Cropton. The North Yorkshire Moors Railway has designated spaces available for wheelchair users.
